#### Welcome to the last newsletter of the 'year'

Now that Europhilex, London 2015 is behind us it is just about time to be looking ahead to 2015/16. Before we do we should note that at least two of the displays at Islington were from members from this region and there were surely more. **Joyce Boyer's** lovely exhibit of **Austrian air mails 1918** -1938 was awarded a large Vermeil medal; **Professor David Stirrups** attained a large gold for his 128 sheet exhibit of **To Portugal from UK: Rates on the British packet service 1810-1859**. Congratulations to both.

Between now and the autumn there will be our first collaboration with **Philanglia** at which we shall be staging our convention at St Ives on Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> June. For this year only the competition exhibits will make up this event, but consideration is being given to offering more in 2016.

In September we shall be hosting our second 'stamp day', this time at Warmington, just to the west of Peterborough, details below. In this village is an excellent pub, the Red Lion. I have provisionally booked a table for 12 with the proviso that meals have been pre-booked from their lunchtime menu (see their website). This would enable some us attending to add a very good pub lunch to an already excellent day.

There will **NO** charge for coming to this day; teas and coffee will be available with an honesty box. There will also be a raffle, and clubs and societies are welcome to bring material to sell at a bourse.

Just a note to show that we are trying to support the whole of our region,; we are already considering next year's autumn event and are looking at the Ely area to try to a good geographical spread to these affairs.

#### **Leighton Buzzard**


As ever a full programme has been followed by the society this year with the following being some of the highlights. Following their visit to display at Henley on Thames on October 15<sup>th</sup> John Hossack gave a wonderful display of Sierra Leone, focussing on the inland railway with covers and cancellations from stops along the line.

Another railway themed evening followed in November when John Powell offered a wide ranging display based on the Metropolitan Railway. It contained railway stamps, covers, cancellations including the practice of 'franking' railway company stamps with a manuscript cross, a truly enthralling gathering. The society hosted the joint pre-Christmas joint meeting with Milton Keynes P S in an evening that had

everything from quizzes, raffles, pass the parcel and of course good food an excellent company. In March Peter and Rosemary Pugh showed Far Eastern British mail carried via the Trans-Siberian Railway They showed material relating to many towns and ports en route, plus changes in track gauge and the different forms of transport used in the early days to provide links for parts of the journey. After visiting Amersham P S in April, May's meeting was illuminated by a display based on lighthouses by Colin Sharp. It included stamps, covers, photographs, maps, books, models and more. **John Spencer** 

#### Covers of the quarter

Mr Smith, who lived in Folkestone just after the Second World War, was obviously a collector and creator of postal history. For here we have two self-addressed covers posted two months apart the first of which did not get past the eagle eyes of the Post Office. This October posting was not accepted with a bisected 5d stamp and so a 5d postage due stamp was affixed and cancelled in Folkestone.



The second envelope did get through the system, partly because it was posted in Folkestone – and not South Kensington, as above – and was also sent on Christmas Eve!
