Convention 2015

The convention this year is based around Philanglia at the Burgess Hall, St. Ives on Saturday 27^{th.}June. The Federation will have a display table in the foyer.

As last year we welcome entries in the usual 9 and 16 sheet formats with certified photocopies being required. This year we are offering the opportunity for societies to submit two entries in each of the 9 sheet inter-society competitions, with one nominated as that society's official entry. Thus we hope to encourage greater participation. Judging will have taken place prior to the annual gathering, so that entries will be available for viewing all day and mark sheets and certificates will be ready. The time for the actual awarding of trophies is yet to be confirmed, but late morning is being proposed. Society secretaries already have all the relevant information needed for this event.

As last year there is a degree of financial support for the cost of photocopying; £5 per entry is available for both society and individual entries. This will be reviewed for 2016.

Society Reports

Isle of Ely

The Isle of Ely Society meets on the first Thursday of the month from September to June. Meetings are held at the Isle of Ely College. Our members travel from Norfolk and Suffolk as well as various Cambridgeshire locations.

Our first get-together in September was an addition to the programme. We visited the British Postal Museum store in Debden, Essex where we found many interesting items from letter boxes to vehicles. Coincidentally, at our first club meeting on the following day, two members gave displays on 'Post Boxes' and GB King George V postal history.

In October, Mr Swindells set up a static display on 'Barley to Bottle' and 'Hops to Hand Pumps' and gave a talk and display on the Ijzer Pilgrimage – following on from World War 1 actions. 'Railways' by K Downing was the popular subject for November's meeting; the TPO material displayed tied in well with our visit to the BPMA store. In December, partners were invited and members presented short displays on a 'Christmas' theme. A seasonal buffet was then enjoyed by all.

A bourse, tied in with our annual competitions' evening saw plenty of sales and competitions won by Alan Hall (2), Terry Wagg and Mike Kentzer.

Fenland Stamp Club

There were 7 Thursday meetings from September to December.

Ifni and Puerto Rico – Spain had started issuing postage stamps for **Ifni** in 1941, initially overprinting Spanish issues. New designs followed in 1943 with further issues released at the rate of about 10 per year until November 1968. Most of these stamps are readily available, usually mint; first day covers are easy to find.

Puerto Rico: the first stamps produced were joint issues with Cuba but they were not generally used until 1856 stamps. The first stamps inscribed Puerto Rico were issued in 1873. The only stamps printed that did not include the King of Spain were the set commemorating the 400th anniversary of Columbus' landing in Puerto Rico.

The Spanish-American was saw the island taken over by the USA and from 1899 US stamps were in use.

POW camps and mail: covering German POW mail from WW1, many single letters were shown displaying censor marks and redactions. The mail was checked for invisible writing. Items, shown, emanated from England, Scotland and the Isle of Man. Material produced by the prisoners was also on view, including Christmas cards.

Club Night – show 'U,V & W': A good variety of material was displayed including Uganda, Victoria, Virgin Islands, Western Australia. The predominant area shown was Wisbech postal history. **Lighthouses/Seamarks**: a display featuring material from several countries showing lighthouses and such seamarks as rock formations, church towers and hills.

Commonwealth Revenues and Fiscals: Another interesting display with many good examples on show; it is interesting to see how small values a hundred years ago can be very expensive now.

Gibraltar: a very well researched and entertaining display beginning with the accidental 'capture' of Gibraltar by the British in 1704 during the war with Spain. The first cover shown was from 1698.

Early letters were mainly naval and military and prior to 1768 bore no dispatch markings. Overland mail was sent via the nearby Spanish town of San Roque. The British packet service commenced in 1807, with rates and marks shown. Gibraltar started to use GB QV stamps from 1857 and used its own stamps from 1886. The second half of the evening featured modern issues with errors, varieties, photographic essays and artwork.

Christmas Special: A comprehensive range of Telegrams from 1937 were displayed, including general, special, congratulatory or royal forms. Examples from overseas and ship to shore telegrams were also evident along with photographs of GPO staff in training and at work. (Colin Knight)

King's Lynn P S

The season started back in September with a burst of **Brazilian** sunshine laid on by Janet and Nick Nelson which included national costume and Brazilian drinks. Two weeks' later we were enthralled by Graham Mark's wide ranging display of material relating to the **British First World War's** campaigns in the Western Desert and up into Palestine and Syria.

In early October we were entertained by members from Spalding who showed **Chinese Air Posts** in the 1900s, followed by material from **Austria and its Olympics.** The first of our two competition evenings came next, with Judge Richard Husband (Cambridge) showing some of his excellent collection of **GB perfins.**

November 14th saw a superb display of Gibraltar, with stamps and postal history from the early 18th century to 1900, given by David Stirrups. He followed this with a selection of modern stamps including preliminary sketches, accepted and unaccepted essays, proofs, the issued stamps, varieties and colour errors.

Two weeks later, a members' night, displaying letters 'O' and 'P' produced the best range of material seen on such an evening.

The December meeting was our usual social affair with our old friend, John Shaw, doing the honours with a display of 'Telegrams – home and abroad' proving to be a most entertaining and of course relating to the year 1937. The display was followed by the usual social gathering. (Mike Kentzer).

Covers of the quarter


This quarter's covers feature the London use of the **Scottish Additional Halfpenny Wheel Tax** which was in force from 1813 until the advent of the Uniform Four Penny Post in December 1839. The levy was made to try to repay the Post Office for its grant to the Scottish turnpikes for loss of income arising from their inability – under law – to charge mail coaches to use their roads.

The first cover was sent **from India in 1817** and took 6 months to reach England. There is a clear cancellation for **Calcutta**, indicating that **no fee had been prepaid**. **It was carried on the ship 'Eliza'** (script name on bottom left). There is no London Ship Letter strike. The **black boxed ½ (Type III)** is a London mark and there are **red receivers for Edinburgh** for 6th December 1817. Several attempts have been made to establish the **final postal charge** – presumably in London – ending with **4/2.** This would have been made up of: a **ship letter rate of 8d** for the voyage to England, and a further **3/6**, which equates to the **triple rate for a letter being carried 500 miles** to beyond Inverness.



Having been posted in **Rotterdam** on 1st April 1829 – **red single ring receiver** – the second letter was carried to London and was received at the London Ship Letter Office – **black crown ship letter strike**, and was then charged ½d for the final part of its journey to Edinburgh over the Scottish turnpikes.

The letter was initially **charged 8d, the ship letter rate**, then **amended to 1/9** to include the **1/1** for the distance from London to Edinburgh. The additional halfpenny mark is another usage of **a Type III London** strike.
