Stamp Day


A wonderful display of Caribbean postal history and what must be (only part of) the finest collection of forgeries were on view for our third such day as we have moved the venues around the Federation.

Bill Gibb, our President, started off the day with 90 sheets of 'British Post Offices in Latin America'. From the early 1800s until the Universal Postal Union, there were many British postal agencies across the world operated by Consulates, government legations and often the local British 'resident'. In Latin America these offices were often to be found at most important sea ports and capitals from Mexico in the north and Argentina in the south, Peru in the west and Brazil to the east.

The display covered not only pre-stamp mail but also the use of British stamps, identifiable by coded cancels unique to each office. This was extended to ship letters and some packet mail from before the opening of these offices.

A particular aspect of the display was the inclusion of many Anglo-French marks on unpaid mail resulting from the 1843 and 1856 Postal Conventions. After 1875, when both France and Britain had joined the U.P.U., many Latin American countries had still not joined and this made alternative arrangements necessary. These arrangements were explained.

Chris Harman followed with just a fraction of his collection of forgeries. This was a magnificent array of forgeries and fake stamps from the most notorious characters in this field, We were treated to the work of engravers such as Jean de Sperati, Harold Treherme with his overprints and surcharges, Francois Fournier, who never claimed that his 'stamps' were genuine and the forged post marks of Madame Joseph. But there was much more and it was difficult to comprehend the sheer volume of such material and the efforts that go into this material. Of course forgery still goes on today with the Nigerian and Chinese well to the fore.

Convention 2017

Next year's Convention will again be held in association with Tony Hender's **PHILANGLIA** at St Ives on Saturday, 24th June. There will be a new trophy for the 9 sheet, inter-society traditional competition as the previous one is 'full'. The **16 sheet competition** which rotates on a three year circle will, next year, be for **postal history.**

Federation AGM

The AGM was held on Saturday 11th November at the Arbury Centre in Cambridge. Fourteen people were present including four patrons.

A positive meeting was informed that finances are healthy and that a re-alignment of the financial and calendar years will produce a subscription-free period of 9 months for societies, details will follow from the treasurer, Richard Husband. An independent examiner has been appointed and he has now passed the last three years' accounts; this replaces an audit, as our operations are too small to make this worthwhile.

The officers and committee members were re-elected en bloc.

Dawes Cup

This is an inter Federation competition which was held annually by Essex and three southern counties. Last year only two Federations remained and so MAPF has been invited to take part in 2017. This is being looked into with a view to taking part.

Cover of the quarter

Airgraphs were invented in the 1930s by Eastman Kodak in conjunction with Imperial Airways and Pan American Airways as a means of reducing the weight and bulk of mail carried by aircraft. The letters were written on airgraph forms, photographed and then sent as negatives on rolls of microfilm. At their destination the negatives were printed on photographic paper and delivered by Armed Postal Services. It is claimed that 1600 letters on film weighed 5 ozs (0.34 kg) - 3/1000 oz each, and 1600 ordinary letters weighed 50 lbs $(22.7 \text{ kg}) - \text{averaging } \frac{1}{2} \text{ oz each}$.
