The **third round was a 'trivia'** one based around the rest of the world including such items as transport of mail. For the first time in several years Bedford did NOT win the quiz; the honour went Leighton Buzzard.

This quarter's cover

Calcutta in north eastern India was the starting point for this entire sent by the Registrar, Supreme Court, to a firm of solicitors in Aberdeen, relating to the estate, in India of a Dr George Lamb.

Posted on 31st December 1834, it arrived in Edinburgh (red receiver) on 21st June 1835 for onward transmission to Aberdeen.

The letter was carried on the **packet**, **Hibernia**, and was marked as having passed through the **Calcutta General Post Office on 2nd January**. It arrived in **Plymouth – India Letter/ Plymouth** – and passed on to **Exeter** where it received the **uniquely small un-framed** ½, a **type IV (DN 643)** before being carried to London an then up the Great North Road.

The total postage paid on arrival in Aberdeen was 3/- plus the ½d, this being made up of 8d ship letter fee and 2/4 the double weight rate for the distance from Devon to the north east coast of Scotland.

Professor David Stirrups FRPSL

It is with great sadness that we have to report the death of David Stirrups on 14th August a great loss to his family and the philatelic world. A professor of Orthodontics since his appointment at Dundee University in 1992, he was a passionate collector of Gibraltar and its associated countries of Spain, Portugal and Morocco, indeed he was recognised as one of the world's experts on this area of philately.

A prolific winner of competitions at Dundee P S and latterly in Cambridge, David was successful at Federation, national and indeed international levels, gaining a Gold at Melbourne in 2013 and two Large Golds in London two years later.

Having joined the Gibraltar Study Circle in 1994, David became its chairman and auctioneer and was its Hon. Secretary until the time of his death. He was made a Fellow of the Royal Philatelic Society in 2006 and was invited to sign the Book of the Society of Scottish Philatelists the following year.

Last year he was one of our presenters at the Warmington Stamp Display Day, together with Jane Moubray, where we were bowled over by his display of cartophilately and particularly his thorough and structured approach to this thematic exhibit.

David had been a natural choice to be the chairman of the 2016 Philatelic Congress in Cambridge last month, but declining health meant that he was unable to continue by the final pre-Congress committee meeting. The Congress was a great success and that was due in no small part to David's diligence and hard work.
