This issue sees the launch of the 2018 competitions which will culminate in the Annual Convention at St. Ives on Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup> June. There is one major change this year. We have introduced a revised mark scheme which seeks to remove an anomaly and also to incentivise better entries in the thematic and Open classes, which really do need to improve on the variety of material on offer to better the theme of the entry.

We feel that at this level 20 marks for rarity in a 9 sheet entry is too many, and as this is an introductory level of competition that more should be awarded for presentation. The same is felt to be true to a slightly lesser extent for the 16 sheet competitions as they are seen as a stepping stone to national (Stampex) level.

For instance most thematic entries offer stamps, miniature sheets and covers, but there are more types of PHILATELIC material available such as booklets, illustrated covers and post marks.

For Open class up to 50% of the material offered may be NON PHILATELIC, but are often restricted to picture post cards and photographs – I've been guilty of this! Why not try fabrics (if relevant), posters, timetables, newspaper cuttings and many more ... the only restriction is the THICKNESS of the material on offer – it must fit under security frames, so about 5 mm maximum, even if such display frames are not in use.

It would seem that in my haste to send out the competition details I forgot to mention where the photocopied entries should be sent (humble apologies).

## King's Lynn P S

On 10<sup>th</sup> February the society celebrated its 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary by holding a lunch time gathering of members and representatives from other societies and the Federation's committee alongside the King's Lynn Stamp Fair.

After an introduction and welcome by President Mike Kentzer, the Borough Mayor, Councillor Mrs Carol Bower was escorted around a display of 150 sheets of King's Lynn's pre-stamp postal history and then presented with a copy of this material in two albums for the Borough by chairman Paul Lascelles. After this a buffet was provided by the local Girl Guides' Group and all present were given a copy of a 36 page colour brochure of the society covering its history and entries from members of the favourite items from their collections.

## Huntingdonshire P S Report (part 2)

The second half of the last season kicked off with two members from Rushden P S displaying. Malcolm Whitehead showed German perfin with both stamps and covers. He was followed by Terry Pope's GB railway stamps for letters, parcels and newspapers and also GWR air mail letter stamps from the 1930s giving a fascinating evening for the members.

Competitions were the theme of the next meeting with judges Adrian Boggust and Roger Carr from Cambridge. While judging was carried out two members displayed Huntingdon postal history and Royal Navy mail. Simon Kelly gave a fine display of 'Bahamas' at the end of February and the Isle of Ely P S graced the next meeting with New Zealand's iconic stamps (Andrew Williamson), GB QEII definitive developments and regionals (Barry Ross Bain) and Captain Cook's voyage (Chris North)

Aspects of Italian philately and revenues with much early material and revenues were shown by Peppe Marinelli at the end of March providing a very comprehensive display of most unusual material. After Easter members were entertained by Jon Higgins with his 'Planes and boats and trains' collection from North Borneo and Labuan followed by early stamps and postal history of the

islands. The French colonies of East Africa around 'the Horn' were offered by Mick Bister were the subject for the next meeting and gave a fascinating glimpse of the history and politics of the area.

Colin Hepper then took members to Nepal for their next evening to a remote country which had only joined the UPU in 1959 showing a wide variety of material which is well worth a wider viewing.

The final gathering of the year welcomed 4 members from Leighton Buzzard P S. On offer were stamps and postal history of the Falklands (John Spencer), George VI C/W stamps – particularly colour variations, perforations and flaws (Paul Peacock), Raptor birds (Paul Page) and stamps and post marks of Sierra Leone (John Hassocks).
