There are welcome signs of a return to a degree of normality and some societies are emerging into the light.

A few societies responded to my request for updates and possible programmes for the autumn and three have a full range of face-to-face meetings, two with Zoom displays intertwined. A couple are meeting early in September to decide the way forward.

It is understandable that progress seems to be slow with the delta variant causing a rise in Covid cases, but given the general age profile of memberships most will be fully vaccinated.

However, there have been several major stamp fairs held, and with due regard to safety, and a number of national societies have held 'normal' residential meetings without there being any problems.

## **Autumn Stampex**

This is being held at the British Design Centre, Islington from 29<sup>th</sup> September to 2<sup>nd</sup> October with admission by **TICKET ONLY.** 

Let me explain:

In order to attend you will need to acquire a ticket - go to the Stampex International website - go to TICKETS and follow the advice.

For entry on the first day there is a charge of £10, but this ticket also gives admission to ALL the other days.

There is NO CHARGE for tickets for any of the other days, but these DO NEED TO BE BOOKED.

Whichever tickets you apply for, you will receive a receipt by email and this will be your ticket.

If you book your tickets(s) before 13<sup>th</sup> September you will receive a reminder email; after this date you won't.

All current guidelines will be in force at the BDC, and they should know as they were a local vaccination centre for several months.

# Federation Stamp Day/AGM

This is still arranged for Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> October at Buckden Village Hall (PE19 5UY), just off the A1 south of Huntingdon.

We are hoping that those attending will offer displays of 1 to 3 frames of 9 sheets of anything they'd like to display. The AGM will follow in the later afternoon.

We are looking into the possibility of arranging tables for those who would like a Sunday lunch at a local pub we've used before; details will follow.

#### **Convention 2022**

We are hoping that Philanglia will be able to go ahead again next summer at St Ives and we hope that with all the opportunities there have been for writing up collections during lockdown, that there will be a bumper crop of entries.

We will feature the 9 sheet inter-society competitions in traditional, postal history and thematic classes, as well as all classes for individual entries with 16 sheets being the order of the day.

Details will be sent out early in the new year.

### Machin Watch with Peter Morton

Note: for the self-adhesive issued stamps no account is taken for the orientation of the printed backing paper, where differences can occur by way of Type 2 paper with Large over Small (L/S) or Small over Large (S/L) layout. Recent issues have also seen the stamps produced with a much thinner backing paper.

# **Post and Go Stamps**

For those who collect either the Machin head or the pictorial strips, effective from  $1^{st}$  September 2020 three new values were introduced: (a) Europe 100g/World 20g, (b) World Zone 1-3, and (c) World Zone 2.

With the Post Office requesting that old P & G material be used up, the 2020 price change is causing a number of new items now being available.

#### **Cover of the quarter**

The cover this time is an envelope – but sent in 1834 and from India, some time before envelopes were more commonplace following the introduction of postage stamps.



Sent from madras in October 1834 the letter, consisting of the envelope and two sheets of paper, took 5 months to reach Edinburgh on its way to Argyllshire.

It was landed at Portsmouth (INDIA LETTER/PORTSMOUTH, In3, HA 1670) and entered the postal service and travelled to London where it received an Additional ½ hand stamp, L 187(12), as shown by the blue arrow.

Here it was charged 1/1 for inland carriage which was crossed out, probably in Edinburgh, where again it was wrongly rated as a double letter and charged 2/10 to which was added 1d for the Lochgilphead Penny Post charge (AR 282a) and the Add ½ tax.

However, this was a tiple rate letter and should have been charged:

4d India Letter fee (up to 3 oz.) PLUS 3 x 1/3 for the 559 miles inland = 4/2 plus of course the 1d and  $\frac{1}{2}$ d.

The confusion will have arisen because of the presence of an envelope which was quite unusual at this time.

# **Zoom displays**


During this awful lockdown period several societies have taken the plunge and through using Power Point software have successfully produced some wonderful displays for others.
